

Daub or Die Halloween Marathon Hot Seats

Friday, October 31, 2025 | 6:40 pm *No Late Night this day.

Official Rules

How to Gain Entry:

- 1. Participants must be 18 years of age or older and have a Muckleshoot Bingo Players Club card.
- 2. On Friday, October 31st, 2025, during the Evening Session beginning at 6:40 pm, participants must purchase a bingo 9-ON or an electronic package from admissions with their Muckleshoot Bingo Players Club Card.
- 3. For this session, 9-ONs will cost \$20 and include 20 Regular Games each paying \$1,199.
- 4. Extra 3-ONs will cost \$7 each and include 20 Regular Games each paying \$1,199.
- 5. Participants who buy-in will also be entered to win one of (20) Hot Seat Drawings for \$100 cash and a Halloween Cake valued at \$20/each.
- 6. Electronic package deals will also be available this day.

Entry Exclusions: Muckleshoot Bingo Employees are NOT eligible to win Hot Seat Drawings.

How to Play/Win:

- 1. Participants must use a dauber on all bingo papers.
- 2. Participants must cover all of the needed numbers in the bingo pattern to win.
- 3. Participants must announce bingo loud enough to stop play.
- 4. Multiple winners will split prize payouts equally.
- 5. After each regular game, Muckleshoot Bingo will randomly draw a hot seat winner using the random Player Draw function in the Live Bingo Management System. Participants must be present to win.
 - a. Muckleshoot Bingo will announce the winning name over the PA system and the winner will have 2 minutes to identify themselves to a Live Bingo floor employee or report directly to the caller stand to receive their \$100 cash prize and cake.
 - b. Participants may only win (1) \$100 cash and cake hot seat prize per session.

Pay Tables

- 1. \$20 for each 9-ON includes 20 Regular Games that each pay \$1,199.
- 2. \$7 for extra 3-ON includes 20 Regular Games that each pay \$1,199.
- 3. Twenty (20) Hot Seat Drawings for \$100 cash and a Halloween Cake valued at \$20/each (\$2,000 total Cash, and \$400 in total cakes).
- 4. Extra games will pay standard payouts.

General Rules:

- 1. All participants must show their Muckleshoot Bingo Players Club card and valid photo identification to be verified as a prize winner.
- 2. The Muckleshoot Indian Tribe (Tribe), any other contest sponsor, and their affiliated entities and their respective officers and employees shall be released and discharged from any and all claims, losses, injuries, demands, or actions which arise out of or are in any way related to the prize(s), the receipt, use or enjoyment of prize(s), or damages or losses related to the contest.
- 3. The Tribe reserves the right to postpone, suspend, or terminate the promotion or amend the rules at any time without notice to participants.
- 4. By entering or participating in the promotion, participants grant Muckleshoot Indian Tribe and its affiliated entities the right to use their names, likenesses, or voices for promotional purposes without further compensation or permission.
- 5. Barred and suspended patrons are not allowed to win any promotional prize and will automatically forfeit any prize.
- 6. Entries and prizes may not be traded or transferred. Substitution of cash, or equivalent for noncash prizes unless expressly stated in the contest rules is not permitted; however, the Tribe at its sole discretion reserves the right to substitute cash in the event that a noncash prize becomes unavailable. In accepting a prize, the winner accepts the prize "as is" with no warranties.
- 7. Players who win free play, non-cash prizes, or cash prizes under \$100 will not be required to provide a Social Security card or complete an IRS Form W-9. For promotional contest prizes of \$100 or more, players must present valid government-issued photo identification and either provide a copy of their Social Security card or complete an IRS Form W-9. Failure to provide the required documentation may result in forfeiture of the prize. Muckleshoot Indian Bingo may also request the player to complete a winner release form.
- 8. Participants acknowledge that prizes may be subject to tax withholding requirements under applicable federal regulations and that payouts may be reduced due to withholding requirements. Winners agree to pay all expenses, taxes, and fees not included in the prize. The Tribe will report winnings in excess of \$600 in cash or fair market value during a calendar year to the IRS, and such winners will receive an IRS Form 1099.
- 9. For promotional contests that require physical participation, selected participants who are physically unable to participate may designate a person other than an employee of Muckleshoot Casino or Bingo to participate on their behalf.
- 10. Participants are responsible for hearing contest announcements, and the Tribe shall not be responsible in any manner for the failure of a participant to hear or respond to contest announcements. In promotional contests involving a drawing, in the event of a public address system failure, the drawing may continue. In such an event, the selected participant's name will be announced without amplification at the drawing location.
- 11. The Tribe is not responsible for lost or stolen entries, coupons, computer malfunctions, or other incidents that result in the loss of entries or prizes.
- 12. The Tribe is not responsible for the inability to enter a drawing due to long lines or other causes.
- 13. Muckleshoot Bingo (MIB) Employees who are eligible to play bingo or VGD machines as outlined in the personnel policies are eligible to play during the promotional timeframe; however, MIB Employees are NOT eligible to win VGD tournaments, drawings of any kind, giveaways, Hot Seat promotions, Free Play promotions, and select discount and coupon offers. Always check the How to Gain Entry/Win sections of the official rules for specific exclusion information.
- 14. Violation of contest rules may result in disqualification.
- 15. Muckleshoot Bingo house rules apply.
- 16. Any guest dissatisfied with a decision/ruling in this promotion may, within thirty (30) days of the disputed decision/ruling, submit their complaint in the form of a written petition for relief to the Muckleshoot Gaming Commission.
